As the largest volunteer child advocacy association in the nation, Parent Teacher Association (PTA) reminds our country of its obligations to children and provides parents and families with a powerful voice to speak on behalf of every child while providing the best tools for parents to help their children be successful students.

PTA does not act alone. Working in cooperation with many national education, health, safety, and child advocacy groups and federal agencies, the national PTA organization collaborates on projects that benefit children and that bring valuable resources to its members.

Georgia PTA serves as a link between the national organization and membership within the state. A person who joins a local Parent Teacher Association automatically becomes a member of National PTA and Georgia PTA.

Georgia PTA represents over 320,000 members at the state legislature, state board of education and other education and child-focused organizations; provides support and training for local PTAs through workshops and publications; coordinates special projects to promote the welfare of Georgia's children and youth, and much more.

Georgia PTA is a registered 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that prides itself on being a powerful voice for all children, a relevant resource for families and communities, and a strong advocate for public education. Alice McLellan Birney

*Co-founder and First President
National Congress of Mothers
1897-1902*

Alice McLellan Birney, a Marietta native and one of National PTA's founders, first spoke about her dream of a mothers' congress committed to addressing the needs of children. Two years later, the first meeting of National PTA would draw over 2000 mothers, fathers, educators, government officials, clergy and other community members interested in improving the lives of children. The movement quickly spread to other cities and states, including Georgia. Today Alice McLellan Birney's dream is still alive, a dream called National PTA.

Selena Sloan Butler

*Founder and First President
National Congress of Colored Parents and Teachers
1926-1931*

In 1899, Selena Sloan Butler, became a mother. That year, she also became a visionary. At that time, the Atlanta community where she lived lacked a kindergarten for black children, so as a concerned parent, she created one...in her living room. When her son enrolled at a local public school, Selena formed the nation's first black Parent Teacher Association. Its success led her to create the Georgia Colored PTA in 1920 and the National Colored Congress of Parents and Teachers in 1926. Selena Sloan Butler centered her life's work on improving the educational environments and upholding the rights of all children, regardless of their race or situation.
